AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 417 AND DESIGNATING THE ONAWA URBAN REVITALIZATION AREA FOR THE CITY ONAWA URBAN REVITALIZATION PLAN FOR THE CITY OF ONAWA, IOWA (AMENDMENT NO. 1 TO THE ONAWA URBAN REVITALIZATION PLAN)

WHEREAS, Chapter 404, Code of Iowa (the "Act"), authorizes cities by ordinance to designate revitalization areas if such areas meet the criteria of the Act and if the City completes the procedural requirements of the Act; and

WHEREAS, by Ordinance No. 417, adopted on June 28, 2011 (the "Designating Ordinance"), the City designated the entire area within the corporate limits of the City as an urban revitalization area under the Act, known as the Onawa Urban Revitalization Area (the "Revitalization Area"); and

WHEREAS, the Plan provided that the Area would be eligible for tax abatement under the Plan for improvements completed on or before December 31, 2021, and further provided that the City Council could amend or extend the Plan's duration and could repeal the Designating Ordinance if the Council determined that the desired level of revitalization had been achieved; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has not repealed the Designating Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, the City, County Assessor, and property owners in the Area have continued to treat improvements completed in the Area after December 31, 2021 as being eligible for tax abatement under the Plan, and accordingly, there has been a de facto extension of eligibility under the Plan; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has taken action to amend the Urban Revitalization Plan for the Revitalization Area by adopting Amendment No. 1 to the Onawa Urban Revitalization Plan for the Revitalization Area, the purpose of which is to update the Area to include any land annexed into the City's corporate limits, extend the duration of eligibility under the Plan retroactively to January 1, 2022 and through improvements completed on or before December 31, 2032, revise the exemption schedules available under the Plan, and make other updates to the Plan; and

WHEREAS, under the Amendment, the description of the Revitalization Area is updated to the following:

All real property contained within the incorporated limits of the City of Onawa, Monona County, State of Iowa, as of June 1, 2011. Any land annexed into the City in the future shall be automatically included in the Revitalization Area as of the effective date of the annexation.

WHEREAS, the Area has heretofore been found to meet the criteria of the Act; and

WHEREAS, the revitalization of the Revitalization Area, as amended, will enhance the rehabilitation, conservation, redevelopment, economic development, or a combination thereof of the Revitalization Area, as amended, and is necessary in the interest of the public health, safety, or welfare of the residents of the City; and the Revitalization Area, as amended, substantially meets the criteria of Section 404.1 of the Act.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ONAWA, IOWA:

Section 1. That in accordance with Chapter 404 of the Code of Iowa, and as a result of the adoption of Amendment No. 1 on February 14, 2023, the legal description of the Revitalization Area shall now include, all property within the corporate limits of the City of Onawa, Monona County, State of Iowa, and any property annexed into the City of Onawa as of the effective date of its annexation to the City.

Section 2. That the Revitalization Area shall remain in existence until the Designating Ordinance, as amended, is repealed pursuant to Iowa Code Section 404.7.

Section 3. That the Designating Ordinance is amended hereby, and all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith be and the same are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 4. That if any section, provision or part of this Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the Ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

Section 5. This Ordinance shall be in effect after its final passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 106.08(1) OF THE ONAWA CODE OF ORDINANCES FOR THE CITY OF ONAWA, IOWA

WHEREAS, the cost to the City of Onawa for the operation and maintenance of the sanitary landfill has increased; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to raise the charge for the operation and maintenance of the sanitary landfill to cover the increased costs to the City;

 - A. Each dwelling user of any City utilities shall be charged \$15.35 per month for refuse plus \$10.00 per month for operation and maintenance of the sanitary landfill.
 - B. Each non-dwelling user of any City utilities shall be charged \$10.00 per month for operation and maintenance of the sanitary landfill, whether or not the user has refuse removed, as set forth in Section 106.01.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that if any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is, for any reason, held to be unconstitutional, such shall not affect the validity of the remaining portion or portions of this Ordinance.
